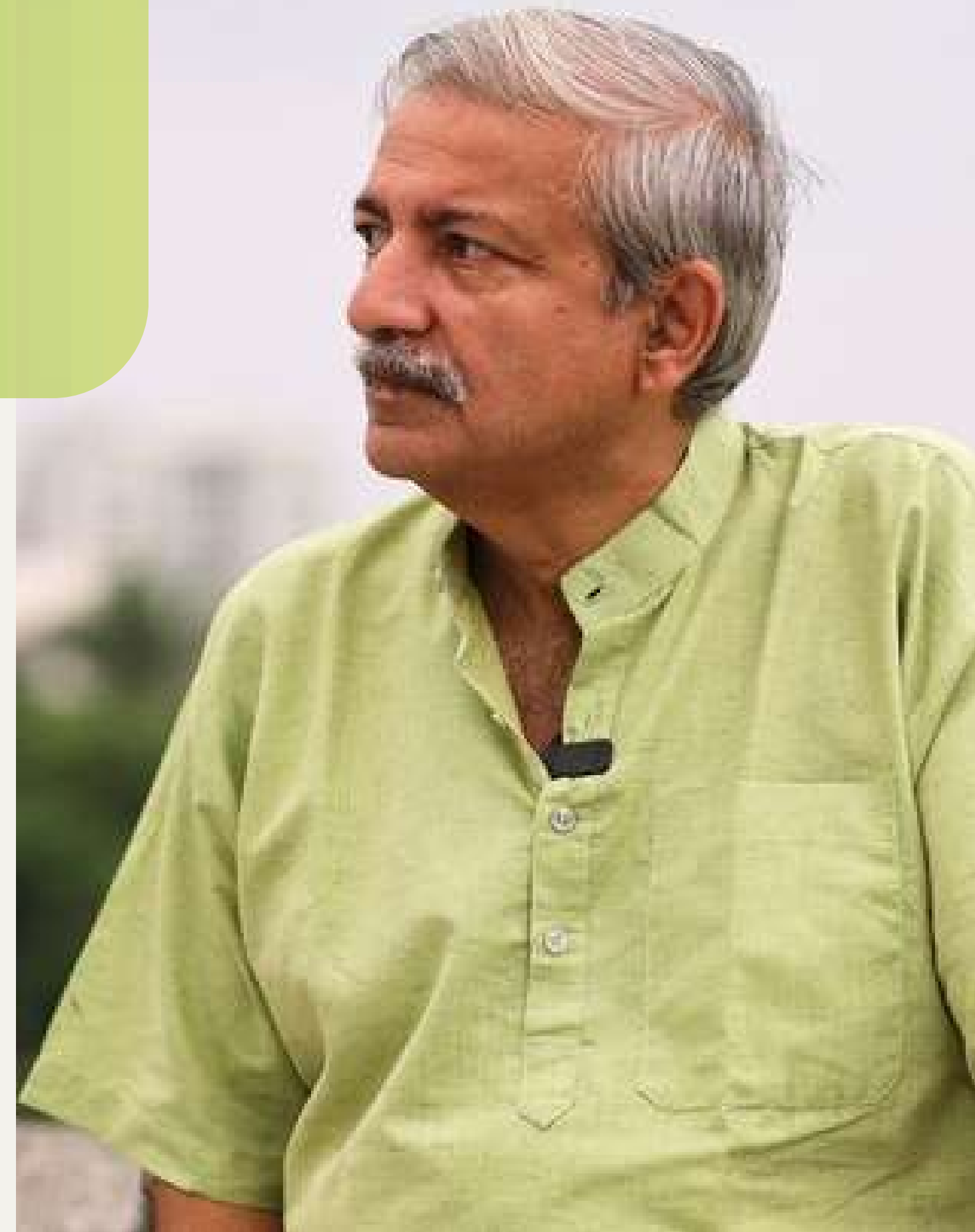

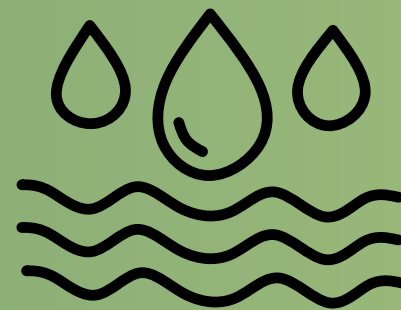

BUILDING FUTURE AGRI-PROFESSIONALS

THROUGH PRACTICAL TRAINING



To provide practical exposure to modern agriculture and sustainable farming practices, students from Aditya Agriculture College, Beed, and Dr. Gangadharrao Pathrikar College of Agriculture, Pathri, visited the GVT Krishikul Training Centre for educational study tours. During the visits, students participated in interactive training sessions and field demonstrations covering scientific farming methods, soil health management, water conservation, horticulture, orchard planning, soil testing, balanced nutrient management, efficient irrigation, and climate-resilient agricultural practices. They also explored how modern technologies can improve farm productivity and profitability. The students actively engaged with experts, observed live demonstration plots, and gained valuable practical knowledge that complemented their academic learning. These visits strengthened their understanding of sustainable agriculture while preparing them to address the evolving challenges and opportunities in the agricultural sector.

GVT commenced the river rejuvenation works on the Saraswati and Gunwara Rivers in Parli Taluka, Beed District, marking another significant step towards sustainable water conservation in Marathwada.

The Saraswati River rejuvenation work was inaugurated by Mr. Ravinderjit Singh, Head - Rural Upliftment Portfolio, Tata Trusts, while the Gunwara River work was inaugurated in the presence of GVT representatives and local villagers, reflecting strong community participation.

The project involves the widening and deepening of both rivers to restore their natural water holding capacity, enhance groundwater recharge, and improve irrigation. The intervention is expected to strengthen water security, revive wells and borewells, and support sustainable agricultural livelihoods for farming communities across the region.

FARMER EMPOWERMENT SEMINAR

PROMOTING THE “MEE SHETKARI” MOVEMENT

 Marathwada

GVT organized a Farmer Seminar Programme, which witnessed enthusiastic participation from the farming community. Addressing the gathering, Mayank Gandhi encouraged farmers to join the “**Mee Shetkari**” movement – a GVT initiative that brings farmers together to adopt sustainable agriculture, diversify into high-value crops, and improve their livelihoods. He also highlighted GVT's river rejuvenation efforts in Marathwada, where 108 km of river restoration works have been completed this year, with a target of 200 km in the coming year. The seminar featured technical sessions on soil and water management, orchard development, and sericulture, along with information on government schemes and financial assistance for establishing new orchards. During the event, the book "Sudharit Mosambi Lagwad Tantradnyan" (Improved Sweet Lime Cultivation Techniques), authored by Dr. M. B. Patil, a renowned horticulture expert, was released. Farmers were also introduced to GVT's initiative to establish the country's largest Farmer Producer Company (FPO), along with other programmes aimed at strengthening market linkages, enhancing farmers' incomes, and promoting sustainable agricultural development.





CAPACITY BUILDING

THROUGH AGRICULTURAL EXPOSURE

To strengthen the technical capabilities of its field team and enhance farmer advisory services, Global Vikas Trust (GVT) organized a two-day agricultural exposure visit to Dr. Balasaheb Sawant Konkan Krishi Vidyapeeth (DBSKKV), Dapoli. During the visit, the team interacted with agricultural scientists and explored research and demonstration units showcasing multi-tier cropping systems, biological input production, medicinal plants, mango and coconut cultivation, spice crops, exotic fruit plantations, and modern orchard management. Experts also shared practical insights on lemon orchard management, orchard rejuvenation, crop diversification, and climate-resilient farming practices. The exposure equipped the GVT team with valuable technical knowledge and innovative agricultural practices, further strengthening its capacity to deliver effective extension services and support farmers in improving orchard productivity, adopting sustainable farming practices, and enhancing rural livelihoods across Palghar district.

EXPANSION OF COMMUNITY

MEAL SERVICE INITIATIVE

Strengthening its commitment to community welfare, Global Vikas Trust expanded its Annachatra (Community Meal Service) initiative with the launch of its third free-meal centre in Ambajogai, Beed district. Building on the successful operation of meal centres at Sirsala and Parli, the new facility extends the Trust's outreach to support more vulnerable and needy individuals.

The Annachatra serves fresh, nutritious, and hygienic meals free of cost every day to patients' relatives, daily wage workers, underprivileged families, and other individuals in need. For many beneficiaries, these meals provide timely relief and essential nutritional support during difficult times.

COMMUNITY CONSULTATIONS

FOR SUSTAINABLE IRRIGATION



To address the challenge of limited irrigation affecting agricultural productivity and farmers' incomes, Global Vikas Trust (GVT) organized community consultation meetings in Fanspada (Wada Taluka) and Sajan (Vikramgad Taluka). The meetings provided a platform for farmers to share their water-related challenges and discuss potential solutions for improving irrigation facilities.

Based on farmers' inputs and field assessments carried out by the GVT team, suitable locations and water resources were identified for future interventions. The consultations laid the groundwork for initiatives such as the proposed community well in Fanspada and water resource development in Sajan, with the objective of improving irrigation access, enhancing agricultural productivity, and strengthening farmers' livelihoods through community-led water management.

DONOR FIELD VISIT

Representatives from the donor organization visited Nipani village in the Dharashiv Cluster, Maharashtra, to review the progress and impact of GVT's ongoing water conservation initiatives with **Delhi Premier Rotary Service Foundation**. The team inspected the Cement Nala Bunds (CNBs) and Global Recharge Aquashafts (GRAs) while interacting with farmers and villagers to understand the on-ground outcomes.

The visit highlighted improved groundwater recharge, increased water availability for irrigation, and enhanced agricultural productivity. The team also visited a mango orchard developed under the project and appreciated its progress. Encouraged by the positive impact, villagers requested the installation of additional GRA units, and potential sites were identified to further strengthen water security in the region.

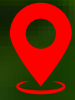

२५ लक्ष वृक्ष लागवड महाअभियान : निसर्ग पुनरुज्जीवनाची ऐतिहासिक हाक!

कृषीकुल येथे जलनायक मयंक गांधी यांच्या उपस्थितीत व्यापक नियोजन बैठक

परळी (प्रतिनिधी) :-

उन्हाळ्यातील वाढते तापमान, अनियमित पाऊस, भूजल पातळीतील घट आणि दिवसेंदिवस बिघडत चाललेले पर्यावरणीय संतुलन ही आजच्या काळातील सर्वात मोठी चिंता बनली आहे. अशा परिस्थितीत केवळ चर्चा नव्हे, तर कृतीची गरज आहे. हीच गरज ओळखून जलनायक मयंक गांधी यांच्या मार्गदर्शनाखाली ग्लोबल विकास ट्रस्ट यावर्षी गुरु पौर्णिमेच्या निमित्ताने तब्बल २५ लक्ष वृक्ष लागवड व संवर्धन महाअभियान राबवत आहे. दिनांक २३ ते २९ जुलै २०२६ या कालावधीत राज्यभर विक्रमी वृक्ष लागवडीचा संकल्प पूर्ण करण्यासाठी परळी वैजनाथ येथील कृषीकुल येथे सरपंच, सामाजिक कार्यकर्ते, पत्रकार, पर्यावरणप्रेमी व विविध क्षेत्रातील मान्यवरांची विस्तृत नियोजन बैठक उत्साहात पार पडली.

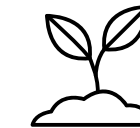

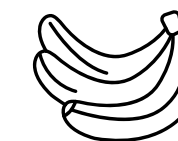

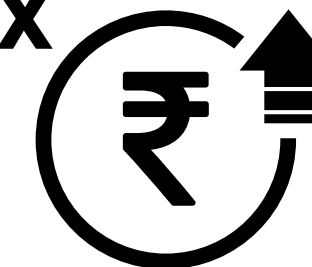

SUCCESS STORY – 2

 Marathwada



An inspiring example of agricultural transformation, this farmer successfully transitioned from traditional farming to the cultivation of the Mulberry V-1 variety. With the dedicated efforts of the family and technical guidance from Global Vikas Trust, the farmer harvested 580 kg of high-quality Mulberry V-1 produce, which was sold at ₹700 per kg.

The harvest generated a gross revenue of ₹4,06,000, resulting in a net profit of ₹3,46,000 per acre per annum. This remarkable achievement demonstrates the high income potential of mulberry cultivation and reflects the positive impact of adopting scientific farming practices with the right technical support.

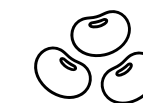

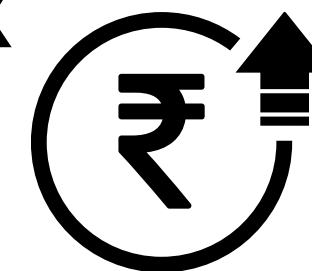

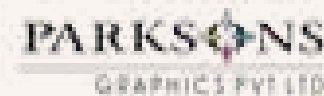
