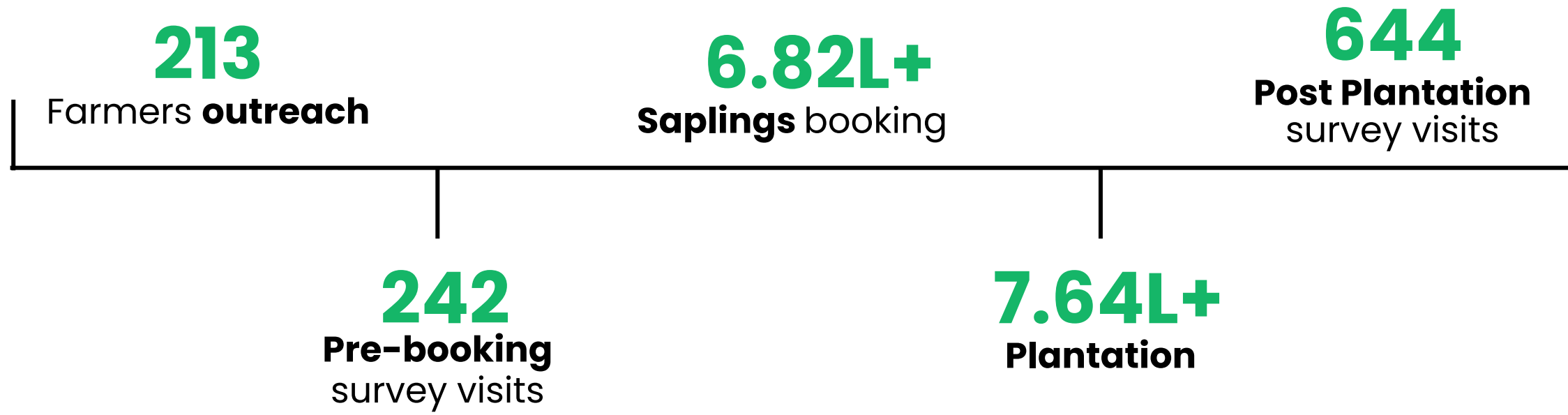

# ADVANCING ORGANIC BANANA CULTIVATION AT KRISHIKUL

Patil, Dr. Sayyed Ismail, and Dr. Dayanand, the session explored strategies to maximize yields through organic practices, enrich soil health, address common cultivation challenges, and review new trials being conducted at Krishikul. The discussion underscored the value of blending scientific guidance with practical experience to strengthen organic farming and promote sustainable productivity for farmers.

Global Vikas Trust (GVT) organized an awareness program on watershed management in the villages of Mankeshwar and Bhandgaon, located in the Bhumi and Paranda talukas.

The session began with the local Sarpanch introducing the purpose of the GVT team's visit and providing an overview of the organization's mission and activities. GVT staff Gulab Rupnar further elaborated on the objectives of the meeting, highlighting Mayank Gandhi's vision and GVT's ongoing initiatives in sustainable water management.

The discussion focused on the region's prevailing water scarcity, the current status of local water resources, and the future roadmap for watershed development. The meeting served as an important step toward community awareness and participation in long-term water conservation efforts.

# DONOR VISITS – FIELD ENGAGEMENTS BY PARTNER ORGANIZATIONS



Mr. Saurabh Anand from the EY Foundation visited farms across Bhoshe, Pirachi Kuroli, and Patwardhan Kuroli in the Akluj Cluster. During the visit, he interacted with local farmers to understand the yield differences between traditional farming and fruit orchard cultivation. He also observed the banana harvesting and box-packing processes at the farmers' plots. The visit concluded with a meeting at the Patwardhan Kuroli Gram Panchayat office, where further discussions were held on agricultural practices and ongoing initiatives with the farmers.



Mr. Faraz Ahmad, Project Director of the Rotary Club of Delhi Premier, along with Mr. Swayang Bikas, Project Coordinator, visited mango farmers in Wagholi, Dharashiv District, who initiated plantations in 2024. They assessed the mango orchards, reviewed the drip irrigation systems, and engaged with farmers to understand challenges in crop management. The visit included discussions at the Gram Secretariat in Upala village with the Gram Vikas Officer, Sarpanch, and Deputy Sarpanch, focusing on the potential for tree plantation initiatives on vacant forest land adjacent to the village.



MakeMyTrip CSR team members Mr. Yuvraj Srivastava & Mr. Rajneesh Kumar Sharma visited their intervention area in Aurangabad with reference to a potential collaboration for the GVT project. The team interacted with farmers, reviewed ongoing activities, and discussed possible avenues of partnership aimed at strengthening rural livelihoods and promoting sustainable development.



These visits reinforced the shared commitment to improving farmer livelihoods through field-based understanding, collaboration, and sustainable agricultural development.

# EMPOWERING FARMERS: UNITY, ADVOCACY, AND ACTION IN BEED DISTRICT

The agricultural community of Beed district witnessed a series of impactful initiatives aimed at empowering farmers, addressing challenges, and promoting sustainable rural development.

## Gram Vikas Manthan – Fostering Unity Among Farmers

The Gram Vikas Manthan program in Bodhegaon brought together thousands of farmers with a shared goal: strengthening the voice of agriculture in the region. Honourable Mayank Gandhi emphasized the necessity of unity, urging farmers to transcend caste, creed, and political affiliations to embrace a singular identity. Highlighting that farmers, despite being the backbone of the nation's food supply, often face neglect and suppression, he encouraged a united front as a means to compel government attention. Held on September 19 at the Bodheshwar Temple, the event featured engaging discussions with local dignitaries and provided a platform for farmers to deliberate on rural development and agricultural advancement.



# FROM FIELD TO GOVERNMENT: FARMERS TAKE ACTION AGAINST CROP DAMAGE

## Village-Level Advocacy – Addressing Crop Losses

The Marathwada region recently experienced heavy rainfall and subsequent flooding, causing significant damage to crops across multiple villages. In Kaudgaon Huda (Parli Taluka) and Rakshaswadi & Mandwa Pathan (Ambajogai Taluka), village meetings were organized to inform farmers about a memorandum campaign seeking government compensation. Farmers were urged to participate collectively, emphasizing the strength of unity in advocating for their rights and ensuring that their grievances are formally recognized.



## Tehsil-Level Action – Formal Submissions for Relief

To tackle the hardships caused by recent floods, memorandums were submitted to the Parli and Ambajogai Tehsil Offices after extensive village consultations. The documents emphasized the damage due to heavy rainfall and sought prompt field assessments (panchanamas) and compensation to support affected farmers.



# FROM VILLAGE TO DISTRICT: FARMERS' RELIEF INITIATIVES WITH THE DISTRICT COLLECTOR

## District Engagement – Government Response and Support

To address the flood situation at a broader level, a group of farmers met with the district administration to discuss the crop losses caused by excessive rainfall. The authorities assured them that detailed assessments would be carried out and appropriate relief measures implemented to support the affected farmers.

This engagement reflects the collaborative efforts between farmers and government officials to ensure timely assistance and safeguard rural livelihoods.



# EXPLORING PINEAPPLE CULTIVATION FOR FARMER PROSPERITY

The GVT team has been consistently visiting the pineapple nursery of Mr. Hemant Chhabra in Zadpoli village, Vikramgad Taluka, to monitor crop performance and evaluate its potential as a feasible, economically viable option for marginal farmers. On 3rd September, a focused assessment was carried out to study the economics of pineapple cultivation, including profitability, sapling sourcing, and sustainability.

During the visit, the team closely observed the farm operations and engaged in detailed discussions on cultivation costs, labour needs, expected returns, and potential profit per acre. Key challenges in cultivation were also reviewed, with practical, field-based solutions explored to enhance productivity and strengthen farmer livelihoods.



# IMPOWERING FARMERS WITH MOGRA: FIELD INSIGHTS AND FUTURE READINESS



As part of its preparation for the upcoming financial year, Global Vikas Trust (GVT) initiated a detailed field assessment to plan large-scale procurement of mogra saplings. The GVT Palghar team conducted visits to nurseries across Jawhar and Vikramgad talukas to evaluate production capacity, assess sapling quality, and understand nursery operations.

The visits focused on key aspects such as stick selection, nursery practices, sapling preparation techniques, and the overall readiness of farmers for bulk supply. Over the course of several days, the team interacted with 7–8 nursery groups to gather comprehensive data and insights into their operational capabilities.

As a follow-up, GVT has requested nursery owners to review the proposed supply plan and confirm their potential sapling output. The collected information will serve as the foundation for finalizing MOUs for the next financial year, ensuring timely and efficient sapling distribution to farmers.

# PLANTING FOR THE FUTURE: AURUM FOUNDATION JOINS HANDS WITH GVT

As part of the annual plantation initiative, members of the Aurum Foundation visited the GVT Wada office to understand Global Vikas Trust's vision, journey, and developmental work in the Palghar region. The GVT team shared insights into ongoing projects, highlighting key challenges faced by farmers such as water scarcity, unstable income, and agricultural uncertainty.

To gain on-ground perspective, the visitors interacted with Mogra farmers in Malwada village, where Ashish Sir explained the technical and economic aspects of Mogra cultivation, including land suitability, cost structure, climate requirements, and post-plantation management.

The visit concluded with a symbolic plantation activity, where the Aurum team planted Mogra saplings, reaffirming their support for sustainable farming and farmer empowerment.

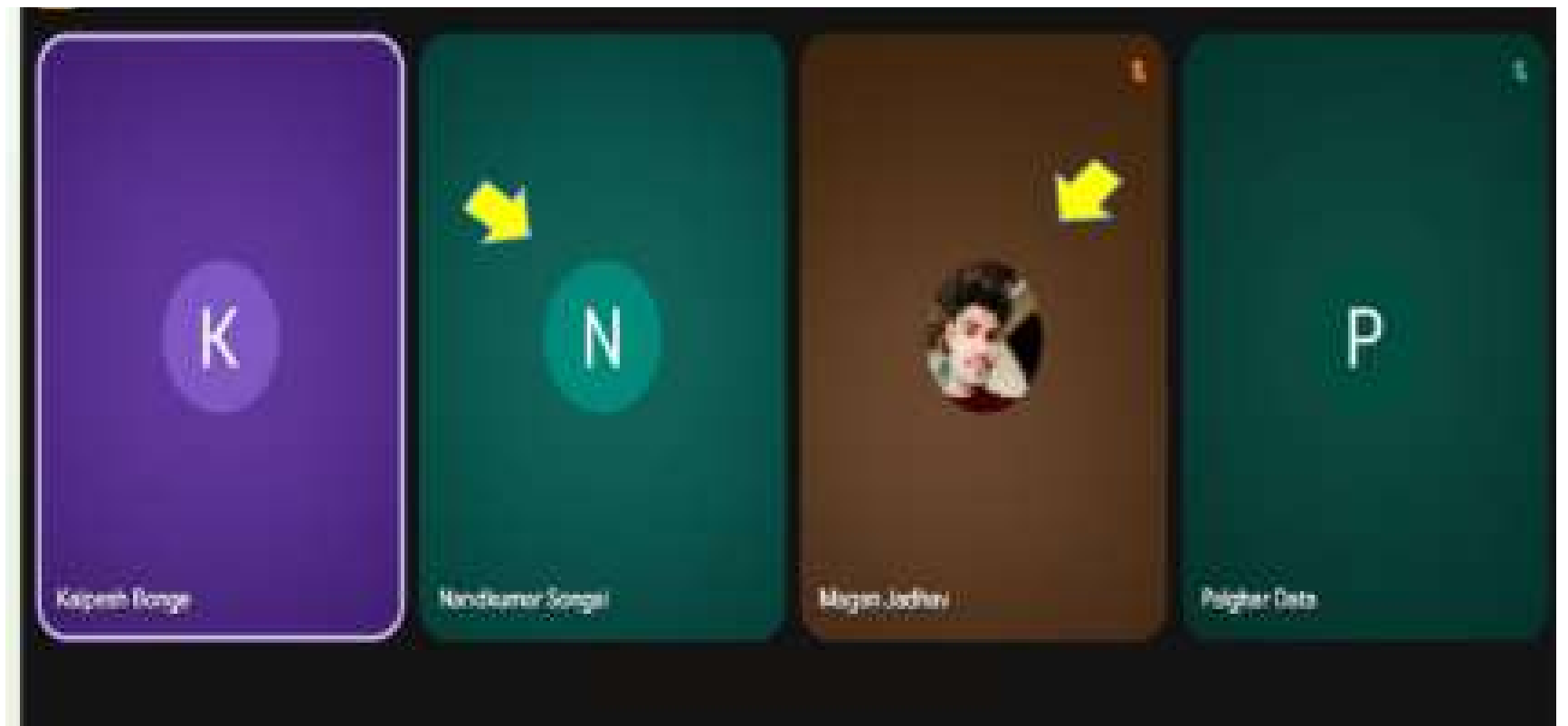


# GVT CONNECTS WITH FARMERS THROUGH ONLINE

## Online meeting – 25 September:

As part of GVT's ongoing monthly farmer engagement initiative, interactive sessions were held online this month as well.

An online farmers' session was conducted from the Wada office, with participation from farmers of Jawhar and Shahapur talukas. The session was highly interactive, with farmers sharing their experiences and raising queries on Mogra cultivation practices, fertilizer use, and pest management. In response, Kalpesh from the GVT team provided detailed guidance, explaining fertilizer types, dosages, and schedules for each growth stage, along with a recommended spray management plan highlighting safe and effective application methods. The session fostered a meaningful exchange of knowledge, enabling farmers to clarify doubts and receive tailored advice for improving crop management and productivity.



# EMPOWERING FARMERS THROUGH PRACTICAL TRAINING ON BANANA CULTIVATION



A comprehensive farmer training program was organized by Global Vikas Trust (GVT), led by the agronomy team, focusing on banana cultivation, soil health, and the effective use of vermicompost. The session covered essential aspects such as pre- and post-plantation care, pest and disease management, fertilizer application, and root growth enhancement techniques.

A total of 21 farmers, including both registered and non-registered participants, actively took part in the training. They engaged enthusiastically, raising practical queries related to root damage, leaf caterpillar control, and nutrient management, which were effectively addressed by the agronomist.

The participants found the training highly insightful and practical, expressing appreciation for GVT's efforts and requesting that such knowledge-sharing sessions be organized regularly to further strengthen their farming practices.
